PETITION FOR ANNEXATION

TO THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILACA, MINNESOTA:

We, the undersigned, all the owners of the territory described below, hereby request the Council to annex this territory to the City and to extend the City boundaries to include the same, and for that purpose respectfully state:

1. The territory to be annexed consists entirely of unplatted lands not exceeding 200 acres in area. All of these lands lie entirely within the County of Mille Lacs, Minnesota, and the description of each such lands is as follows:

TRACT ONE: The South 396 feet of the East 528 feet of the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-four (24), Township Thirty-eight (38), Range Twenty-seven (27), containing 4.80 acres, more or less.

TRACT TWO: The West 50 feet of the East 250 feet of the North 500 feet of the South 1100 feet of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ ) of Section Twenty-four (24), Township Thirty-eight (38), Range Twenty seven (27), containing 0.58 acres, more or less.

2. The territory and land described above abuts upon the City limits of the City of Milaca, Minnesota on the south and west portion of Tract 1 and upon the east portion thereof of Tract 2 and none of said lands are presently included within the corporate limits of any incorporated city.
3. That all of the said territory and land is urban or sub-

urban or is about to become urban or suburban in character.
