## AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF HINCKLEY TO INCLUDE CERTAIN LAND OWNED BY GRAND CASINO MANAGEMENT ABUTTING THE CITY OF HINCKLEY

WHEREAS, GCM had filed a petition dated 4-19-94, requesting that certain land, as legally described below:
See Attached Exhibit E
be annexed to the City of Hinckley, and
WHEREAS, GCM represents that they are the sole owners of the respective property, that the property is unincorporated, abuts the limits of the City of Hinckley, is not included within any other municipality, is not included in any area that has already been designated for orderly annexation pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 414.0325, and is approximately 59.9 acres in size.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of Hinckley, Minnesota, does hereby ordain:
Section 1. The City Council hereby determines and finds that the property abuts the municipality, that the area to be annexed is sixty (60) acres or less, that the property is not included in any area that has already been designated for orderly annexation pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 414.0325 , that the municipality has received a properly prepared Petition for Annexation from all of the owners of the property, and that the Petition complies with all of the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 414.033.

Section 2. The property is urban in nature or about to become so.
Section 3. The corporate limits of the City of Hinckley are hereby extended to include the property and the same is hereby annexed to and included within the City of Hinckley as if the property had originally been part thereof.

Section 4. The City Clerk is directed to file certified copies of this Ordinance with the Minnesota Municipal Board, Barry Township, the Pine County Auditor, and the Minnesota Secretary of State.

Section 5. This Ordinance takes effect upon its passage and publication and the filing of the certified copies as directed in Section 4 and approval of the Ordinance by the Minnesota Municipal Board.

Councilmember Tom Beutel seconded the foregoing Ordinance and all voted in favor.
WHEREBY the Ordinance was declared duly passed and ordained.
