## ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

- 3. Pursuant to the agreement of the parties and as allowed by Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2016), there will be no reimbursement from the City to the Township as stated in Ordinance Number 701 and the Township's February 27, 2017 Receipt for Reimbursement waiving any reimbursement.
