**ORDER APPROVING
ANNEXATION ORDINANCE**

On February 23, 2018, the City of Lindstrom (City) adopted a Notice of Intent to Annex pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3 (2016).

No objection by the Chisago Lake Town Board (Township) was served pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3.

On July 19, 2018, the City adopted Ordinance Number 20180719-09 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) legally described as follows:

Lot 27, Lakelawn Beach, Chisago County, Minnesota. (PID 02-01413-00)

AND

Jackson Street (known presently as Lakelawn Drive) adjoining Lot 27, Lakelawn Beach according to the plat on file and of record in the Office of the County Recorder, Chisago County, Minnesota lying between the southwesterly extension of the northwesterly line of said Lot 27 and the southwesterly extension of the southeasterly line of said Lot 27.


Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2016), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
3. Pursuant to agreement of the City and Township, and as allowed by Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2016), no reimbursement shall be made by the City to the Township.

4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.

NOTICE

Any party may submit a written request for an amendment of this Order within seven days from the date of the mailing of the Order pursuant to Minn. R. 6000.3100 (2017). However, no request for amendment shall extend the time of appeal from this Order.
