ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

On June 18, 2018, the City of Buffalo (City) adopted Ordinance Number 2018-6 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) owned by Wright County from Buffalo Township (Township) legally described as follows:

The West 11 acres of all that part of the NW¼ of the NW¼ of Section 17-120-25, lying North of a line described as follows: Begin at a point on the West line of said Section 17, 104 rods North of the West quarter post and running thence South, 81½ degrees East across the NW¼ of the NW¼ of Section 17-120-25.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

- 1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2018), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
- 2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
- 3. As there is no taxable property within the Property, the provisions of Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2018) are not applicable.
- 4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
