ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

On July 16, 2018, the City of Prior Lake (City) adopted Ordinance Number 118-11 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Credit River Township (Township) legally described as follows:

The West 919.00 feet (as measured at right angles) of that part of the North Half of the Northwest Quarter (N¹/₂ of NW¹/₄) of Section 7, Township 114, Range 21, Scott County, Minnesota, lying North of the Northerly right of way line of Eagle Creek Avenue, Scott County, Minnesota. (PID 049070010)

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2018), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.

2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.

3. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2018), the City will reimburse the Township \$382.59 each year for two years as stated in the Ordinance.

4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
