In the Matter of the Annexation of Certain Real Property to the City of Lindstrom from Chisago Lake Township (MBAU Docket A-8174)

## ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

On September 20, 2018, the City of Lindstrom (City) adopted Ordinance Number 20180920-01 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Chisago Lake Township (Township) legally described as follows:

That part of Government Lot 5 of Section 10, Township 33 North, Range 20 West, Chisago County, Minnesota, lying between the southerly extension of the east and west lines of Lot 21 and southerly of the south line of South Shore Drive, all on the recorded plat of Gerub Beach, Chisago County, Minnesota, and lying northerly of the center line of the existing township road, containing 0.1 acre, more or less, and subject to the existing township road along the south line. Subject to easements and reservations of record.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

## ORDER

- 1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2018), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
- 2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
- 3. Pursuant to agreement of the City and Township, and as allowed by Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2018), no reimbursement shall be made by the City to the Township.
- 4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
