## ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

On December 20, 2018, the City of Lindstrom (City) adopted Ordinance Number 20181220-01 (Ordinance) annexing certain real city-owned property (Property) from Chisago Lake Township (Township) legally described as follows:

The Easterly 402 feet of Government Lot Seven (7), Section Twenty-eight (28), Township Thirty-four (34), Range Twenty (20), together with an easement for roadway/access purposes over the South 33 feet of the following described tract: The South 624 feet of Government Lot 7, lying East of Public Highway and West of the East 402 feet thereof, Chisago County, Minnesota.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

## ORDER

- 1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2018), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
- 2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
- 3. As there is no taxable property within the Property, the provision of Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2018) are not applicable.
- 4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
