**ORDER APPROVING
ANNEXATION ORDINANCE**

On September 21, 2021, the City of Waseca (City) adopted Ordinance No. 1093 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Woodville Township (Township) legally described as follows:

That part of the NE¼ of the SE¼ of Section 17, Township 107, Range 22 West in Waseca County, Minnesota legally described as follows:

Commencing at the NE corner of the SE¼ of Section 17, thence South 00°18'40" West 339.60 feet along the East line of the SE¼ of Section 17, thence South 88°13'09" West 200.13 feet to the Point of Beginning, thence North 81°55'50" West 504.62 feet along the southerly right-of-way line of the Chicago Northwestern Railway Company, thence South 00°18'40" West 196.97 feet, thence South 89°41'20" East 260.00 feet, thence South 78°15'21" East 244.85 feet, thence North 00°18'40" East to the Point of Beginning, containing 2.00 acres, more or less.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2020), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
3. As there is no taxable property within the Property, the provisions of Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2020) are not applicable.
4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
