In the Matter of the Orderly Annexation of Certain Real Property to the City of Lindstrom from Chisago Lake Township (MBAU Docket OA-1685-1)

ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION

A joint resolution for orderly annexation (Joint Resolution) was adopted by the City of Lindstrom (City) on September 21, 2017, and Chisago Lake Township (Township) on November 21, 2017, requesting the designation and immediate annexation of the certain real property (Property) legally described as follows:

A 150 foot wide parcel of land in Government Lot One (1), Section Four (4), Township Thirty-three (33) North, Range Twenty (20) West, Chisago County, Minnesota, bounded on the south by the northerly line of the recorded plat of SANDEEN HEIGHTS, bounded on the west by the easterly right-of-way of Olinda Trail (also known as County State Aid Highway No. 25), bounded on the north by a line drawn parallel with and 150 feet northerly of, as measured at right angles to, the northerly line of SANDEEN HEIGHTS and bounded on the east by the shoreline of South Center Lake.

Based upon a review of the Joint Resolution, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.0325 (2016), the Joint Resolution is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.

2. Pursuant to the terms of the Joint Resolution and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.

3. Pursuant to the agreement of the parties and as allowed by Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2016), the City will reimburse the Township \$396.65 each year for four years as stated in the Joint Resolution.
