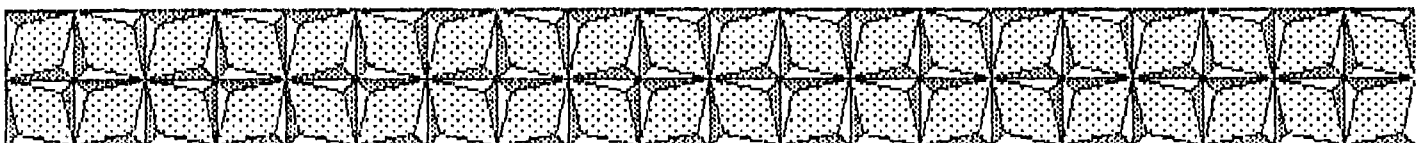

6e Ordinance No. 586 - Worke Annexation

It was moved by Councilmember Wobschall; seconded by Councilmember Kozan; to discontinue consideration of Ordinance No. 586, entitled AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LANDS (WORKE PROPERTY) TO THE CITY OF WASECA, MINNESOTA AND ESTABLISHING THE ZONING THEREOF; the motion carried 6-0.

8a Hospital Helicopter Landing Site

Dennis Miley, Hospital Administrator, spoke to the City Council concerning a request to block 5th Avenue NW between State Street and 2nd Street N.W. for the periodic landing of the helicopter from the Mayo Clinic which will be transporting critically ill or injured patients from Waseca Hospital to the medical facilities at Rochester.

In response to a question from the City Attorney, Mr. Miley indicated the Hospital would be responsible for the signing of the street and the parking lot to alert people of the need to move cars in a short period of time; and would also take responsibility for the liability and cost of towing any vehicles necessary.

The police would assist in the closing of the street.

It was moved by Councilmember Clemons; seconded by Councilmember Wobschall; to authorize the closing of 5th Avenue N.W. between 2nd Street N.W. and State Street for the temporary landing site of the hospital helicopter and to authorize the removal of the street light next to the hospital parking lot and authorize the police department to cooperate with the closing of the street; the motion passed 6-0.

Councilmember Kozan expressed concern that as a permanent solution this may not be the best approach.

8b Maplewood Water Line

It was moved by Councilmember Rohde; seconded by Councilmember Collins; to authorize City staff to proceed with preparation of plans and specifications for the extension of a water main from 13th Street S.E. to the easterly City limits along Highway 14; to be constructed in conjunction with the Clear Lake walkway and riprap project; the motion passed 6-0.

In response to a question from Councilmember Kozan; the City Manager indicated the \$150,000 cost of the project would be funded through the Water Reserve Fund and would not cause an increase in the City water rates in the future.
