

ORDINANCE NO. 149

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF PEQUOT LAKES TO INCLUDE CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY OF WHICH MORE THAN 60 PERCENT OF THE PERIMETER OF THIS TERRITORY IS BORDERED BY LAND WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS AND ABUTTING THEREON.

WHEREAS, certain territory described below is not presently included within the corporate limits of any incorporated city or borough; and

WHEREAS, more than 60 percent of the perimeter of this territory is bordered by lands already included within the corporate limits of the city and is deemed to be urban or suburban in character;

THE CITY COUNCIL OF PEQUOT LAKES ORDAINS:

Section 1. Territory annexed.

The corporate limits of the City of Pequot Lakes, Minnesota, are hereby extended to include the unplatted territory described as follows, 60 percent or more of the perimeter of which territory is bordered by territory already included within the city limits: South 333' of West 444' of Southwest 1/4 of Southwest 1/4, Section 11, Range 29W, Township 136N.

Section 2. Filing.

The city clerk is directed to file certified copies of this ordinance with the Secretary of State, the County Auditor of the county in which the property is located, the Town Clerk of the affected township and the Minnesota Municipal Board.

Section 3. Population.

The population of the annexed territory is six (6).

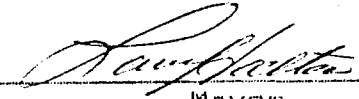
Section 4. Effective date of annexation.

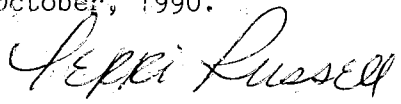
