**ORDER APPROVING
ANNEXATION ORDINANCE**

On September 19, 2017, the City of Isanti (City) adopted a Notice of Intent for Annexation pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3 (2016).

No objection to the Notice of Intent for Annexation was filed by Isanti Township (Township) pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3.

On January 16, 2018, the City adopted Ordinance Number 686 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) owned by Lloyd D. Stevens legally described as follows:

The South 436 feet of the West 250 feet of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 28, Township 35, Range 23, Isanti County, Minnesota.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2016), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.

2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.

3. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2016), the City will reimburse the Township \$33.21 each year for three years as stated in Ordinance Number 686.

NOTICE

This Order is the final administrative order in this case under Minn. Stat. §§ 414.033, .07, .09, .12 (2016). Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7 requires that a copy of the annexation ordinance be filed with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.07, subd. 2, any person aggrieved by this Order may appeal to Isanti County District Court by filing an Application for Review with the Court Administrator within 30 days of this Order. An appeal does not stay the effect of this Order.

Any party may submit a written request for an amendment of this Order within seven days from the date of the mailing of the Order pursuant to Minn. R. 6000.3100 (2017). However, no request for amendment shall extend the time of appeal from this Order.
