**ORDER APPROVING
ANNEXATION ORDINANCE**

On July 16, 2018, the City of Prior Lake (City) adopted Ordinance Number 118-10 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Spring Lake Township (Township) legally described as follows:

Parcel A (PID 119120021)

The West 329.07 feet of South 1323.57 feet of the Southeast Quarter of Section 12, Township 114, Range 22, Scott County, Minnesota.

Parcel B (PID 119120025)

That part of South 1323.57 feet of the West Half of the West Half of the Southeast Quarter of Section 12, Township 114, Range 22, lying East of the West 329.07 feet of said Southeast Quarter, Scott County, Minnesota.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2018), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
3. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2018), the City will reimburse the Township \$1,205.60 each year for two years as stated in the Ordinance.
4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township,

the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
