In the Matter of the Annexation of Certain Real Property to the City of Madison Lake from Jamestown Township (MBAU Docket A-8348)

ORDER APPROVING ANNEXATION ORDINANCE

On July 19, 2021, the City of Madison Lake (City) adopted Ordinance No. 2021-01 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Jamestown Township (Township) legally described as follows:

All that part of the Northwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of the Southwest Quarter of Section 34-109-25 which lies northwesterly of the right-of-way of what was, in 1938, the Great Western Railway, excepting therefrom 3 acres in the northeast corner of said area, described as, commencing at a point 60.24 feet West of the north-east corner of said NW¼ SW¼ Sec. 34, on the westerly side of said right-of-way, running thence due West along the ¼ line 566.26 feet, thence due South 461.6 feet to the said right-of-way, then north-easterly along the said right-of-way to the place of beginning.

Excluding any land already in the city's corporate limits.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2020), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.

2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.

3. Pursuant to the agreement of the parties and as allowed by Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2020), the City will reimburse the Township \$125 as stated in the Ordinance.

4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.
