**ORDER APPROVING
ANNEXATION ORDINANCE**

On July 22, 2022, the City of New York Mills (City) filed a Notice of Intent for Annexation with the Office of Administrative Hearings pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3 (2022).

No objection was filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings by the Newton Town Board pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 3.

On December 13, 2022, the City adopted Ordinance No. 132 (Ordinance) annexing certain real property (Property) from Newton Township (Township) legally described as follows:


All that platted area as shown on "Plat of Southside Addition to New York Mills" as filed with Otter Tail County, Minnesota, except land already within the City.

Based upon a review of the Ordinance, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.033 (2022), the Ordinance is deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly supports this Order.
2. Pursuant to the terms of the Ordinance and this Order, the Property is **ANNEXED** to the City.
3. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.036 (2022), the City will reimburse the Township \$1,000 each year for two years as stated in the Ordinance.
4. The City must file a copy of the Annexation Ordinance with the Township, the appropriate county auditor(s), and the Secretary of State as required by Minn. Stat. § 414.033, subd. 7.

NOTICE

This Order is the final administrative order in this case under Minn. Stat. §§ 414.033, .07, .09, .12 (2022). Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.07, subd. 2, any person aggrieved by this Order may appeal to Otter Tail County District Court by filing an Application for Review with the Court Administrator within 30 days of this Order. An appeal does not stay the effect of this Order.

Any party may submit a written request for an amendment of this Order within seven days from the date of the mailing of the Order pursuant to Minn. R. 6000.3100 (2021). However, no request for amendment shall extend the time of appeal from this Order.
