IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION FOR DETACHMENT OF AGRICULTURAL LANDS FROM THE VILLAGE OF BELLINGHAM, COUNTY OF ~~LAKE~~ LAC QUI PARLE, MINNESOTA, UNDER LAW 1959, CHAPTER 686, SECTION 6, AS AMENDED.

O R D E R

The Village of Bellingham, County of ~~Lake~~ Lac qui Parle, Minnesota, has by resolution at a regular meeting, petitioned for the detachment of certain property adjacent to the municipal boundary, incorporated and occupied, and used exclusively for agricultural purposes, herein described, from the Village of Bellingham, Minnesota.

The territory involved consists of:

"The North Half of the Southwest Quarter (N $\frac{1}{2}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Nineteen (119), Range Forty-five (45), containing 80 acres, and

Outlots Three (3), Four (4), Seven (7), Eight (8), Eleven (11), Twelve (12), and Fifteen (15), except that part of Outlot Three described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the northeast corner of said Outlot Three (3), thence running due east a distance of 345 feet along the northerly boundary line of said Outlot 3, thence south 76 feet, thence due west 345 feet to the westerly boundary of Outlot 3, thence due north 76 feet to the point of beginning, all in Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Nineteen (119), Range Forty-five (45), containing approximately 35.40 acres."

The property is unplatted and is used and occupied exclusively for agricultural purposes. This detachment would not unreasonably affect the symmetry of the municipality. The land is not needed for reasonable anticipated future development. The petition is in proper legal form and sets forth the information required in Laws 1959, Chapter 686, Section 6, as amended, and upon all the files and records, the Commission being fully advised in the premises.

IT IS ORDERED: That the described real property be and is hereby detached from the Village of Bellingham and set aside.
