The evidentiary hearing concerning this Petition will reconvene on Monday, June 25, 2012, beginning at 9:00 a.m. at the Erskine City Hall, 105 Ross Avenue, Erskine, MN 56535. The hearing will be before Administrative Law Judge Raymond R. Krause. This is a continuation of the first hearing on this matter held on March 6, 2012.

The only formal parties to this proceeding to date are the Petitioners, City of Erskine, and Knute Township. The Petitioners have petitioned the State for authority to detach certain land.

The hearing will be conducted pursuant to the procedure set out in Minn. Rules, Chapter 6000 as supplemented by Minnesota Rules 14.57 - 14.62. The property proposed for detachment is described as follows:

Government Lots Four (4) and Five (5) Section Four (4) Township One Hundred Forty-eight (148) North, Range Forty-two (42) West of the 5<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian.

Following the close of the hearing, the Chief Administrative Law Judge will issue a written final decision pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 414 and the April 17, 2012 referral from the Municipal Boundary Adjustment Unit.
