## STATE OF MINNESOTA OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

In the Matter of the Detachment of Certain Real Property from the City of Lake Elmo to Stillwater Township (MBAU Docket D-604) ORDER APPROVING DETACHMENT

On May 14, 2019, a Property Owner Petition for Detachment (Petition for Detachment) was filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings requesting detachment, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06 (2018), of approximately 1.08 acres of certain real property (Property) from the City of Lake Elmo (City) legally described as follows:

All that part of Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter (NW¼ NW¼) of Section Six (6), Township Twenty-nine (29), Range Twenty (20), described as follows: Beginning at a point on the West line of said Section 6, 923 feet South of the Northwest corner; thence North 73 degrees 0 minutes East a distance of 330 feet; thence South parallel to the West section line a distance of 148.5 feet; thence South 73 degrees 0 minutes West a distance of 330 feet to the West line of said Section 6; thence North along the West line a distance of 148.5 feet to the point of beginning. Washington County, Minnesota.

On April 16, 2019, the City adopted Resolution Number 2019-025 (City Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment. On April 11, 2019, the Stillwater Town Board (Township) adopted a resolution (Township Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment. The resolutions were filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings on May 14, 2019.

Based upon a review of the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, the Township Resolution, and finding that the detachment would be in the best interests of the Property, the Chief Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

## ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06, the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, and the Township Resolution are deemed adequate in all legal respects and found to properly support this Order.

2. Pursuant to this Order, the Property is **DETACHED** from the City of Lake Elmo.
