**ORDER APPROVING
DETACHMENT**

On March 10, 2021, a Petition for Detachment (Petition for Detachment) was filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings requesting detachment, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06 (2020), of certain real property (Property) from the City of Blackduck (City) legally described as follows:

The Northeast One-Quarter of the Southwest One-Quarter (NE¼ of SW¼), less the North 562 feet thereof, Section 18, Township 149, Range 30, Beltrami County, Minnesota.

On March 8, 2021, the City adopted Resolution No. 2021-06 (City Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment. On March 9, 2021, the Summit Town Board (Township) adopted a resolution supporting the Petition for Detachment (Township Resolution). The City Resolution and Township Resolution were filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings on March 10, 2021

Based upon a review of the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, and the Township Resolution, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

ORDER

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06, the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, and the Township Resolution are deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly support this Order.

2. Pursuant to this Order, the Property is **DETACHED** from the City.
