**ORDER APPROVING  
DETACHMENT**

On October 17, 2022, a Petition for Detachment (Petition for Detachment) was filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings requesting detachment, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06 (2022), of certain real property (Property) from the City of Currie (City) legally described as follows:

The west 700 feet of the East Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 17, Township 107 North, Range 40 West, Murray County, Minnesota, lying north of the centerline of County State Aid Highway No. 51 and northeasterly of the northeasterly right of way line of Minnesota Trunk Highway Number 30.

On October 11, 2022, the City adopted Resolution No. 10-11-22-31 (City Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment. The Murray Town Board (Township) adopted a resolution (Township Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment on October 14, 2022. The City Resolution and Township Resolution were received by the Office of Administrative Hearings on October 17, 2022.

Based upon a review of the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, and the Township Resolution, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

**ORDER**

1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06, the Petition for Detachment, the City Resolution, and the Township Resolution are deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly support this Order.

2. Pursuant to this Order, the Property is **DETACHED** from the City.
