## STATE OF MINNESOTA OFFICE OF ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS

In the Matter of the Detachment of Certain Real Property from the City of Meire Grove to Grove Township (MBAU Docket D-656)

## ORDER APPROVING DETACHMENT

On July 27, 2023, a Petition for Detachment (Petition for Detachment) was filed with the Office of Administrative Hearings requesting detachment, pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06 (2022), of certain real property (Property) from the City of Meire Grove (City) legally described as follows:

The E½ of NE¼ of SE¼ of Section 18; and all that part of the NW¼ of SW¼ of Section 17 lying westerly of the west right of way line of Minnesota Trunk Highway No. 4 as established in the Final Certificate recorded April 22, 1943 in Book 52 of Miscl., Page 298 in the office of county recorder of Stearns County, Minnesota, all in Township 125, Range 33, Stearns County, Minnesota.

On July 17, 2023, the City adopted a Resolution (City Resolution) supporting the Petition for Detachment. The City Resolution was received by the Office of Administrative Hearings on July 27, 2023. No resolution was received from the Grove Town Board (Township).

Based upon a review of the Petition for Detachment and the City Resolution, the Administrative Law Judge makes the following:

## ORDER

- 1. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 414.06, the Petition for Detachment and the City Resolution are deemed adequate in all legal respects and properly support this Order.
  - 2. Pursuant to this Order, the Property is **DETACHED** from the City.
