IN THE MATTER OF THE PETITION AND RESOLUTION FOR THE  
DETACHMENT OF LAND FROM THE VILLAGE OF BELLINGHAM

O R D E R

The Minnesota Municipal Commission received a petition for the detachment of land from the Village of Bellingham, Minnesota, on the 25th day of September, 1968 by the owners. A petition for the detachment of the same land was filed by the Village of Bellingham on the 23rd day of October, 1968.

The territory involved consists of the following:

The East Half ( $E\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the Southeast Quarter ( $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) of the Southeast Quarter ( $SE\frac{1}{4}$ ) less a lot containing  $\frac{44}{100}$  of an acre in the southeast corner thereof, of Section Four (4) in Township One Hundred Nineteen (119) North of Range Forty-five (45) West of the 5th Principal Meridian.

Less that area described as follows:

Commencing at the southeast corner of Section 4, 119-45 running thence west on the Section line to a point 83 ft. west of said section corner, running thence north parallel with the east line of said section to a point 233 feet north of the south line of said section, running thence east a distance of 83 feet to the east line of said section, thence South 233 feet to the point of beginning.

The property is adjacent to the Village of Bellingham and said lands are unplatted and used exclusively for agricultural purposes. The petition is in proper legal form and sets forth the information required in Minn. Stat. 414.06 and upon the files and records, the Minnesota Municipal Commission being fully advised in the premises.

IT IS ORDERED: That the foregoing described real property be, and the same hereby is, detached from the Village of Bellingham, and made a part of the Township of Perry, the same as if it had originally been made a part thereof.
